LATIN

- *Minimus* Chapter 6 – Off to town ('Vado Eboracum':
- Read about a planned trip to Eboracum (York) for the Roman family.
- Consolidate the concepts of verbs, nouns and adjectives in Latin.
- Learn and memorise the new vocabulary.

- Read and translate a Latin play based on vocabulary learnt in the chapter.
- Greek myth of Actaeon and Diana
- *Minimus* Chapter 7 – The military machine:
- Learn Latin words for different Roman weapons.
- Understand imperatives in Latin to express commands relating to military orders in the singular (one person) and plural (more than one person).
- Greek myth of the Trojan horse.

FRENCH

- Ice cream:
- Learn 10 ice-cream flavours.
- Apply knowledge of different ice-cream flavours to the structure 'I would like' + conjunction 'and'.
- Specify whether they would like their ice-cream in a cone or a small pot.
- Specify how many scoops they would like as well as some transactional vocabulary in order to take part in a role-play.
- Phonics 2 phonemes: I - IN -IQUE - ILLE.

RE

- Hindu Deities - to develop an understanding that deities represent aspects of one god, Braham
- Goddesses- to appreciate the significance of female deities
- Hindu Creation – to be aware of the Hindu belief in a deity who is a creator and protector
- Hindu Symbols - to understand the concept of symbols in religion
- Mahatma Ghandi- to understand the importance of Ghandi as a faith healer
- Diwali – to understand the concept of good overcoming evil
- Holi- to give an insight to another Hindu festival
- Festival Calendar- to understand how the Hindu calendar matches the international one
- New Baby - understanding the significance of some of the samskars (sacraments) associated with the birth and the naming of a baby

- Marriage - to become aware that symbols are used in ceremonies of many faiths and to understand the meaning of some of the Hindu wedding symbols

PE

- Developing striking and fielding skills (including aiming at targets)
- Catching using a variety of techniques, striking balls of different sizes using different parts of the body and a variety of objects
- Judging line and length and develop hand-eye coordination
- Net and wall games, developing the accuracy of throwing and catching skills
- Choose and use a range of tactics and strategies continuing to develop skills in net games
- Adapt and create new rules for net games

GAMES

- Running, jumping and throwing activities, taking part in simple challenges and competitions
- As in all athletic activities, children think about how to achieve the greatest possible speed, height, distance or accuracy
- Fielding, throwing, catching and batting in games of Rounders and Cricket
- Identify areas in performances that require improvement and work on improving them
- Opportunity to apply skills in small sided matches

- Logic and Coding


To encourage children to use learned and practised strategies to complete problem solving and develop independent thinking:
